Silver Springs Edible Garden Group

Work wrapped up in the Silver Springs Community Garden on Saturday October 20th with a long-awaited Fall Clean-up. With our early October bout of snow, the garden group was sure the clean up would have to wait until spring, but Mother Nature graciously allowed us a few more weeks of fall this year. The garden group was able to get back to work and clean things up in the garden before the winter months. Tasks completed include: distributing compost in each allotment box; adding peat moss to the perimeter garden beds; adding a layer of straw mulch to the rose bushes and strawberries; and restacking / sifting the compost piles. Amending your soil with organic matter like compost and peat moss is a great idea for fall since organic soil amendments are not immediately available to plants. This way, it gives the amendments an entire winter and spring to become biologically active and therefore available to your plants come spring time. Tilling the soil is another great task for fall as it opens the soil to incorporate amendments, relieves compaction, increases oxygen, and improves drainage. Mulching with straw helps to hold in moisture, shade out weed seedlings come spring, and add nutrients to the soil. Straw is a great mulch option as it is clean, light, and breaks down relatively easily.

A brief meeting with coffee and Timbits helped to recap the 2018 season (a successful year!). Planning is well under way for the 2019 Speaker Series as well as a few special projects for the new year, such as investigating the possibility of a garden shed on site. A reminder to all current members that your box rental fee is due by March 1st, 2019.

Wondering what to get the gardener on your list this Christmas? Try gifting some indoor gardening supplies! Sun-loving edibles can easily be grown indoors in containers supplemented by LED lights. Choose some easy seeds, like salad greens, herbs, and strawberries, to start an indoor winter garden. Visit your local garden centre or hardware store for a beginner indoor growing kit that includes containers, soil, grow lights, and seeds. There's no need to give up gardening in the winter months as long as you have the right equipment to get started.
