

Councillor Report

I am extremely pleased Council unanimously supported the passing of the "Rowan Park in Haskayne" outline plan. The ability to move forward on this significant development was the result of Council's vote to remove the Growth Management Overlay of 12 communities. This decision will benefit all Calgarians in terms of an increased tax base, ongoing investments, positive effects on housing affordability and the creation of 1000's of jobs.

Over the total build-out, \$70MM in levies will be paid by the developers, which represents over \$2.4B in total economic value. At total build-out, the area will be home to 19,000 Calgarians.

Rowan Park in Haskayne is truly a game changer for North West Calgary. The innovative design of the community meets both the environmental and financial sustainability needs for The City of Calgary. The density is actually more than what the Beltline is. As well, this community will provide the missing link in pathway and trail connections from Calgary to Cochrane, including Haskayne Legacy Park and Glenbow Ranch Provincial Park. This new community ties in nicely with Greenwich in the NW with its upcoming 60,000 sq. ft. Calgary Farmers Market.

On a separate note, and outside of North West Calgary, Council supported my Notice of Motion to move on the BMO convention expansion, when completed will generate over \$267MM every year to the Calgary economy. These projects involve significant work by many people. I would like to thank everyone for their hard work to get these projects to the finish line! Please join me in celebrating these Calgary building accomplishments.

Hayley's Rink

Ideal skating and ice making conditions, which started in mid December, carried on well into the New Year enabling both hockey players and pleasure skaters alike the luxury of long comfortable skates on the complex of rinks east of the Silver Springs Community Center. Although school and work commitments caused the number skaters in January to dwindle from Christmas holiday peaks, the rinks continued to draw skaters of all ages from around the city to enjoy one of Canada's favorite outdoor pastimes. Two short unseasonal winter heat waves, during which daytime highs exceeded +10C, did minor damage to the ice surfaces causing a loss of the use of the rinks for a day or two but once normal winter conditions returned, our volunteer crews were able to restore the surfaces with a simple sweep and one to two floods.

Seven crews consisting of Silver Springs' residents of all ages, who care for the rinks on each day of the week, have also enjoyed the experience of maintaining this year's ice. Very little snow fall and temperatures hovering just below 0C have made it easy for our crews to make and maintain near perfect outdoor ice. Enhancing our volunteer's ice making experience, the motorized sweepers and snow blowers used to clean the rinks ran all month without a single break down. Preventative maintenance performed by John Tuck is paying off in a big way this year. John combines his Saskatchewan farm boy experience with good common sense to head off equipment failures before they become major expenses. We give a special shout out to John for his efforts and the pride he takes in keeping our aging fleet of machines fully operational! Teens, are you looking for a job? Refereeing will offer you the opportunity to develop life skills, establish self confidence, keep you fit, and enjoy the outdoors. Refereeing Basics

Saturday, April 13 9:15am- 10:15am

Session will be held at the Silver Springs Community Centre

Cost: \$50 - includes a ref kit, whistle, and referee jersey. 100% of the fee will be refunded once you have refereed three community games and you have attended the training.

This introductory workshop for first time referees is geared towards learning the beginner concepts of refereeing. We will review referee requirements and rules based on the FIFA soccer laws. After completing the course, you will be eligible to ref Norwest's U10 House League games. You must be at least 12 years of age to register. You must attend the class to ref this season.

U10 refs receive \$20 per game refereed. *This is not a certified training course from the Alberta Soccer Association.*

Fundamentals of Refereeing for 11 Aside Soccer

Saturday, April 13 10:30am – 11:45am

Session will be held at the Silver Springs Community Centre

Cost: \$50 – includes a ref kit, whistle, and referee jersey. 100% of the fee will be refunded after you have attended the referee workshop and you have refereed three community games.

This workshop will provide a review of referee requirements and rules based on FIFA soccer laws, including fouls and off-sides. It is geared towards refereeing U13, U15, and U16/18 House League games. This course is suitable for returning referees who want a refresher, or new referees who are eligible to ref the older age groups. You must attend the class to ref this season. U13 games earn refs \$25, U15 games earn refs \$30 and U16/18 games earn refs \$35 per game. *This is not a certified training course from the Alberta Soccer Association.*
